
ORDER STRIKING PLEADING

THIS MATTER is before the Court *sua sponte*. On August 27, 2007, the Court entered an order imposing sanctions on *pro se* litigants William H. Payne and Arthur R. Morales for their frivolous litigation activities [Doc. 100]. The Court's order further directed that the Clerk of the Court accept no further pleadings in this case save for a possible notice of appeal or payment of the sanctions which the Court ordered be paid within thirty days.

On September 19, 2007, Mr. Payne and Mr. Morales filed a pleading in contravention of the Court's order. The pleading, Doc. 101, is a Motion for Relief From Order Adopting Magistrate Judge's Report and Recommendation, Striking Pleadings, and Imposing Sanctions for Reasons of Misrepresentation and Other Misconduct and Voidable Judgments. The pleading should not have been accepted for filing, as it is in violation of the Court's earlier order directing that no further pleadings be accepted in this case.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Plaintiffs' pleading [#101] is stricken from the record.
